- ITINERARY-

Day 1, November 16, Saturday: Depart Toronto

Today: This afternoon, depart Toronto Pearson International Airport via Lufthansa Airlines for

our overseas journey to Catania via Munich.

Complimentary meals and beverages will be served aloft. (D,B)

Day 2, November 17, Sunday: Arrive in Catania | Syracuse.

Afternoon: We'll arrive at Catania Airport. Go through Passport Control, claim our luggage and a

Peter's Way tour manager will meet us as we exit Customs. Board our private motor coach

and we will be on our way Syracuse, for hotel check-in.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at hotel in Syracuse. (D)

Day 3, November 18, Monday: Syracuse | Agrigento

Breakfast at our hotel. Morning:

This morning we'll visit Syracuse, where the Apostle Paul stayed for three days after he

departed Malta en route to Rome (AA 28:11-13). Today, Syracuse is a small, sun-bleached provincial capital, but in ancient times it was the western capital of Magna Graecia and one of the greatest cites in the world. Many buildings from this ancient period have survived. Most are in the "archaeological zone," the town's ancient Parco Monumentale della Neapoli (Viale Rizzo). We'll visit the Catacombs of John with its magnificent frescos and the crypt of Marziano, site of the first Christian Church on the Island. After our visit we'll



continue to visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Tears, a place of pilgrimage, prayer, and recollection of a miracle, where Mary wept from a humble plaster plaque of the Immaculate Heart in the heart of the city of Syracuse. The reliquary containing the tears of Mary is the heart of the shrine. Next, visit the Duomo and the church of Santa Lucia alla Badia, located on the south side of Piazza Duomo. Inside the church there is a very famous painting by Carravaggio, St. Lucia's Funeral. St. Lucy is the patroness of Syracuse. Celebrate Mass at the Shrine of St. Lucy, sung by the Mosaic Canadian Vocal

Ensemble. Independent lunch.

Afternoon: We'll continue to Agrigento for hotel check-in.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Agrigento. (B,D)

Day 4, November 19, Tuesday: Agrigento | Monreale | Palermo

Morning: Breakfast at our hotel.

This morning, we'll Tour Agrigento, "Land of the Gods," and meet our local guide. Described by the Greek poet Pindar as "the most beautiful city of mortals," the symbol of the city is a group of magnificent temples occupying a valley. The origins of Agrigento date from 581 BC. The 5th century marked the apogee of the town, and it was then that the main temples were erected. The classical city comprises of magnificent temples and tombs. The finest are Tempio di Giove (Olympian Zeus), the largest Doric temple ever known; Tempio di Giunone



(Juno/Hera), which commands a view of the valley; and Tempio della Concordia, one of the best-preserved temples in the world.

Independent lunch.

Afternoon:

We'll leave Agrigento for the Conca d'Oro to visit Monreale, the site of the famous Cattedrale di Santa Maria la Nuova, built by King William II between 1172 and 1176. Undisputedly the most important Norman church in Sicily, it contains some extraordinary medieval artwork. The facade is grand, but nothing to compare with the vast interior, the walls of which are almost entirely covered with mosaic scenes from the Old and New Testaments. The eye is drawn immediately to the apse, where a magnificent portrait of Christ Pantocrator ("Ruler of All") gestures in blessing and gazes serenely off to one side. Celebrate Mass at the



Cathedral of Monreale, sung by the Mosaic Canadian Vocal Ensemble. After Mass, we'll


continue to Palermo for hotel check-in.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Palermo.

Day 5, November 20, Wednesday: Palermo | Cefalù

Morning: Breakfast at our hotel.

This morning, we'll have a panoramic tour of Palermo! Palermo is a city of wide boulevards, old quarters, town houses, architecturally harmonious squares, baroque palaces, and modern buildings. Palermo is bordered on the north by 1,800-foot Monte Pellegrino, which Goethe described as "the most beautiful promontory in the world. We'll enjoy a guided tour of the **Cathedral of Santa Maria Assunta**. It is characterized by the presence of different styles, due to a long history of additions, alterations, and restorations, the last of which occurred in the 18th century. After our visit we'll continue to Cefalù, on the northern coast of Sicily on the Tyrrhenian Sea.



Visit Cefalù Cathedral, a 12th century fortress-like structure with elaborate Byzantine mosiacs and soaring twin towers. Celebrate Mass at Cefalù Cathedal, sung by the

Mosaic Canadian Vocal Ensemble Independent lunch in Cefalù.

Afternoon: Return to Palermo. Free afternoon to explore on your own. Evening: Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Palermo. (B,D)

Day 6, November 21, Thursday: Palermo | Naples | Sorrento/Seiano

Morning: Buffet breakfast at hotel.

This morning, we'll have an orientation tour of Palermo. Visit the Palazzo dei Normanni, once the seat of the Kings of Sicily during the Norman domination and served afterwards as the main seat of power for the subsequent rulers of Sicily. Inside are the Cappella Palatina and La Sala di Re Ruggiero, glittering chambers encrusted with mosaics of eastern influence. Continue to the Church of St. John of the Hermits (*San Giovanni*



degli Eremiti), a lovely Arab-Norman church built in 1132 at the request of Norman King Roger II. It has picturesque red domes and a cloister with elegantly wrought columns and a beautiful tropical garden. **Celebrate Sunday Mass at the Cathedral in Palermo.**

Afternoon: We'll be transferred to the Airport in Palermo for our continuing flight to Naples. Upon

arrival in Naples, we'll be transferred to our hotel in Seiano for check-in.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at hotel in Seiano or Vico Equense. (B,D)

Day 7, November 22, Friday: Positano | Amalfi Towns

Morning: Buffet breakfast at hotel. Today the group will travel by mini-buses along the Amalfi coast. Our first stop is in

Positano with its commanding view of the sea. From Positano, continue on to the town of Amalfi where we will visit the Cathedral of St. Andrew the Apostle and the crypt where the saint's relics are kept in the central altar.

Independent lunch in Amalfi Town.

Afternoon: After Mass we continue along the coast to Ravello, said to be

nearer to the sky than the sea. Then, we pass through Minori, Maiori, Vietri Sul Mare and Salerno.

Return to our hotel.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at hotel in Seiano or Vico Equense.

Day 8, November 23, Saturday: Pompeii | Rome

Morning: Breakfast at hotel.

This morning, we'll explore the incredibly well-preserved remains of this

ancient Roman town, where all life was suddenly stopped by an eruption of Vesuvius in the year 79 A.D. Pompeii was destroyed, and completely buried, during a long catastrophic eruption of the volcano Mount Vesuvius spanning two days in

AD 79. The volcano collapsed higher roof-lines and buried Pompeii under 60 feet of ash and pumice, and it was lost for nearly 1700 years before its accidental rediscovery in 1748. Since then, its excavation has

provided an extraordinarily detailed insight into the life of a city at the height of the

Roman Empire.

Afternoon: We'll leave for Rome the "Eternal City." History, evolving over 2,500 years, will be made

visible for you by the Roman ruins, 15th century churches, 17th century palaces and 20th

century monuments. Early evening check-in at hotel in Rome.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome.

Day 9, November 24, Sunday: AM/Sung Mass at St. Peter's Basilica | Afternoon, Tour

Ancient Rome, followed by evening Concert Presentation

Breakfast at hotel. Morning:

This morning, we'll be transferred to St. Peter's Basilica for 9:00am or 10:30am.Mass at St. Peter's Basilica sung by the

Mosaic Canadian Vocal Ensemble.

At Noon attend the Papal Blessing (Angelus) at St. Peter's

Square. Independent lunch.

Afternoon: Continue our day with a visit to the ancient Roman Forum. See the Arch of Titus and the

Arch of Constantine and proceed to the outside of the Colosseum for a fascinating explanation of its history. Continue on to the grandiose

white marble monument of King Victor Emmanuel II, often called the "Wedding Cake." See the Trajan Column and the Market (the ancient Roman equivalent of a department store). Continue to St. Peter's Square in time to attend the noon Papal Blessing, where we'll hear Pope Francis' Angelus

address in St. Peter's Square.

Dress rehearsal and Concert presentation at the Church of St. Agnes or at the Basilica of **Evening:**

the Apostles, presented by the Mosaic Canadian Vocal Ensemble.

Overnight at our hotel in Rome.









Day 10, November 25, Monday: Tour of the Vatican Museums | Sistine Chapel | St.

Peter's Basilica | Tour of Imperial Rome

Breakfast at our hotel. Morning:

> Our morning of sightseeing begins with a visit to one of the great art collections in the world: the Vatican Museums. Walk in the footsteps of the Princes of the Church through the richly decorated galleries. Continue on to the Sistine Chapel, the private chapel of the Popes, where Michelangelo best

expressed his genius in monumental frescoes. End our morning tour in St. Peter's Basilica. Take in the outstanding architecture and the statues adorning the largest of all Christian churches, including Michelangelo's magnificent "Pietà." Pray at the new tomb of St. John Paul II in St. Sebastian's Chapel. If time permits, you may wish to independently visit the Vatican Crypt to see and pray near the tomb of St. Peter and the final resting place of numerous Popes among incredible works of art. Independent lunch.

Afternoon:

Enjoy a walking tour and experience the best of ancient Rome. Begin at Piazza di Spagna, one of the most famous squares in Rome. From the Fontana della Barcaccia (Fountain of the Old Boat), in the middle of the piazza, climb the famous Spanish Steps to the top. Continue

to the Trevi Fountain and toss in a coin. Our next stop is the Pantheon. Built more than 1800 years ago, the magnificent Pantheon still stands as a reminder of the great Roman Empire. The name Pantheon refers to the building's original function as a temple for all the gods. When approaching the front of the Pantheon we can see still see the original Latin inscription by Marcus Agrippa. Visit to the nearby Church of San Luigi dei Frrancesi to see The Calling of St. Matthew,



painted by Baroque master Caravaggio. Continue on to the beautiful lively Piazza Navona, the Church of St. Agnes, and Bernini's fountain.

Evening:

Our gala dinner will be at a restaurant in Rome. Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and friendship and taste the Mediterranean cuisine in a typical Roman setting with wine and music. Overnight at our hotel in Rome. (B,D)

Day 11, November 26, Tuesday: Rome | Lucca

Breakfast at our hotel. Morning:

This morning we leave Rome to the gentle Tuscan hills


(five-hour bus ride to Lucca).

A stop will be made at one of the wineries for wine

tasting the snacks.

Afternoon: Check-in at hotel in Lucca. Freshen-up.

> At 4:00pm. Walk to the Cathedral of San Martino for the 5:00pm Mass sung by the Mosaic Canadian Vocal

Day 12, November 27, Wednesday: Lucca | Turin

Morning: Breakfast at our hotel.

This morning we will have a walking tour of center Lucca, you may get the impression that the city isn't quite as grand as its Tuscan neighbors. That all changes when you reach the Piazza San Michele. This L-shaped square is bursting with graceful architecture, including the Praetorian Palace, converted banks, and the square's focus, the Chiesa di San Michele in Foro. Taking center stage, this white marble church has a steep front facade packed with columns and statues. Continue on to Piazza Napoleone and view Palazzo

Ducale di Lucca. Independent lunch.

Afternoon: We leave Lucca drive north to Turin. (Three hour Bus ride).

If time permits, Celebrate 5:00pm. Mass at the Cathedral of St. John, sung by the Mosaic

Canadian Vocal Ensemble.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at hotel in Turin. (B,D)

Day 13, November 28, Thursday: Turin | Bergamo

Morning: Breakfast at our hotel.

This morning, we'll visit the **Cathedral of St. John the Baptist** (*Duomo*). The Cathedral, built in 1498, is an excellent example of Renaissance architechture, with a Romanesque Campanille. The Cathedral houses the Holy Shroud of Turin. According to tradition, the 14-foot by 4-foot linen cloth is the burial shroud of Jesus. In passages underneath the church, you may view artifacts relating to the shroud. In the Chapel of the Holy Shroud (*Capella della Sacra Sindoen*), a replica can be viewed, as the Shroud itself is only brought out for special occasion (the last time the Holy Shroud was exoposed was in 2010). **Celebrate Mass at the Cathedral.** After our visit, we leave Turing to Bergamo (two- and

half-hour bus ride). Independent lunch upon arrival in Bergamo.

Afternoon: We tour Bergamo, on the foothills of the Alps. Bergamo has a prominent place in music

history. The large Romanesque church of Santa Maria Maggiore, begun in 1137, had a continuous and well-documented tradition of music teaching and singing for more than eight hundred years. **Celebrate Mass at Santa Maria Maggiore.** After Mass, we visit the

town including, Cappella Colleoni, and Piazza Vecchia.

Evening: Dinner and overnight at hotel in Bergamo. (B,D)

Day 14, November 29, Friday: Return from Rome

Morning: After an early breakfast at hotel, we will be transferred to Rome's Leonardo da Vinci Airport for our return flight home. Arrive on the same day. (B
